## INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

### 1. Editorial coverage

The journal covers all aspects of forest economics, and publishes scientific papers in subject areas such as the following: (i) forest management problems: economics of silviculture, forest regulation and operational activities, managerial economics; (ii) forest industry analysis: economics of processing, industrial organization problems, demand and supply analysis, technological change, international trade with forest products; (iii) multiple use of forests: valuation of non-marketed goods and services, cost-benefit analysis of environment and timber production, external effects of forestry and forest industries; (iv) forest policy analysis: market and intervention failures, regulation of forest management, ownership, taxation; (v) forestry and economic development: deforestation and land use problem, national resource accounting, contribution to national and regional income and employment.

### 2. Types of contribution

Papers reporting original research in any of the above areas are the principal contents of the journal. Review papers and short technical notes are also welcome. Manuscripts will be refereed and, if accepted, published in a coming issue.

### 3. Refereeing

All contributions will be submitted to referees. Names of referees will be kept confidential. In cases of disagreement between the referees, the editors will arbitrate.

### 4. General layout of manuscript

There are no specific instructions concerning the layout of the submitted manuscript. However, manuscripts typed in double spacing on one side of the paper are preferred. Line numbering is highly recommended. Three copies are required. The manuscript should include the following items: (a) titlepage including a short title of the manuscript; an abstract of 50-100 words, a keywordlist, the names and affiliations of all the authors, and the name and address of the corresponding author; (b) the main text; (c) acknowledgments; (d) appendices (if any); (e) references. Tables and illustrations (diagrams, drawings etc.) with captions may be included in the main text. If the paper is accepted for publication the author will receive more detailed instructions concerning the layout and form for submission of the final manuscript.

### 5. Illustrations

Submit illustration files separately from text files. Files for full colour images must be in a CMYK colour space. Colour figures can be printed only if the costs are covered by the author (€ 250.00 for first colour figure and € 200.00 for every subsequent figure). All illustration files should be in TIFF or EPS formats. Journal quality reproduction will require greyscale and colour files at resolutions yielding approximately 300 dpi. Bitmapped line art should be submitted at resolutions yielding 600-1200 dpi. For detailed information on artwork instructions, please refer to <http://www.elsevier.com/artworkinstructions>.

### 6. Manuscripts should be in English

Both American-English or British-English spellings are accepted; however, each manuscript should use one or other of these consistently. ### 7. Proofs and offprints

There are no page charges. The principal or corresponding author will be sent proofs for checking and, at no cost, will be provided with a PDF file of the article via e-mail. The PDF file is a watermarked version of the published article and includes a cover sheet with the journal cover image and a disclaimer outlining the terms and conditions of use. Additional offprints may be ordered when proofs are returned.

### 8. Copyright

Once a paper is accepted, authors will be asked to transfer copyright (for more information on copyright, see <http://www.elsevier.com/authorsrights>). A form facilitating transfer of copyright will be provided after acceptance. If material from other copyrighted works is included, the author(s) must obtain written permission from the copyright owners and credit the source(s) in the article.
